

## Dear traveler, **HEALTH COMES FIRST**



The Peruvian Government has taken the following measures to fight COVID-19:

- Foreign travelers are permitted to enter Peru only if they have a negative molecular test (PCR). This test must be done a maximum of 72 hours before travelling to Peru. Also, an affidavit must be completed [here](#).
- As of January 4, all travelers arriving to Peru must quarantine for 14 days at their home, temporary isolation center or accommodation. At the sixth day of quarantine, travelers may take a second molecular test (PCR) to confirm that they do not have coronavirus in order to resume their travel.
- Due to the new variant of SARS-CoV-2, all long-haul flights that are over eight hours are suspended until **January 31, 2021**.
- The **use of a mask in public is mandatory**, and the importance of hand washing and maintaining social distance is reminded constantly.
- The National State of Emergency will run until **March 7, 2021**, as well as a curfew from 23:00 to 04:00 in the regions of Amazonas, Ayacucho, Huancavelica, Loreto, San Martín and Ucayali.
- In the regions of Arequipa, Apurímac, Cajamarca, Callao, Cusco, Huanuco, La Libertad, Madre de Dios, Moquegua, Pasco, Puno, Tumbes and Lima City, the curfew will run from 21:00 to 04:00, and with restriction of vehicles on Sundays.
- In the regions of Ancash, Ica, Junin, Lambayeque, Lima provinces, Piura and Tacna, the curfew will run from 19:00 to 04:00, and Sunday all day.
